

Fourteenth Sunday after Trinity The Cry of Faith: Lord, Have Mercy

The ten lepers cried out from a distance, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" (Luke 17:11–19). Their condition cut them off from God and others. So also do the works of the flesh cut us off from God and others. "Those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God" (Gal. 5:16–24). Thus we cry out with the lepers, "Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy; Lord, have mercy," eagerly seeking His good gifts. Jesus said to the lepers, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed. So too, we walk by faith and not by sight, being confident of Jesus' help before we see any evidence of it, trusting that Jesus' cleansing words of forgiveness will restore us to wholeness in the resurrection. Let us be as the one leper who returned to the true High Priest to give Him thanks and glory. For Jesus bore our infirmities in His sacrifice at Calvary. His words are life to those who find them, and health to all their flesh (Prov. 4:10–23).

- Trust they receive Christ's body and blood in, with, and under the bread and the wine for the forgiveness of sins
- Acknowledge their sinfulness and desire to live a new life in Christ

As this Sacrament is a public confession of our shared faith, we ask visitors to speak with a pastor or an elder before communing. This ensures all who commune receive this gift as a blessing rather than to their harm (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). We are happy to answer any questions you might have about the Lord's Supper.

From Word to the World



Your LCMS Latin America and the Caribbean Missionaries and their families

In early August, missionaries and their families from across Latin America and the Caribbean gathered in the chapel of the International Center in St. Louis for our annual missionary conference. The photo above, taken from the chapel's glass walls, captures a striking contrast: God's people gathered around His Word and Sacraments, while just beyond the windows, two major highways hum with the busyness of the world. It is a vivid reminder that the Church always stands at the crossroads of Word and world-called to be nourished in Christ and then sent back into the world to proclaim His Gospel. For us as missionaries, this yearly gathering is a vital part of sustaining the mission. It provides time for worship, rest, and encouragement in God's Word, while also offering opportunities for training, reflection, and collaboration. In the field, it is easy to become isolated or focused only on immediate needs, but the conference draws us back to the bigger picture: Christ's mission through His Church to bring the Gospel to the nations. By gathering, we are reminded that we do not labor alone, but as part of a larger body joined in the same confession, strengthened to return to our places of service with renewed zeal and hope.

One Lord, One Faith, One Baptism

The annual missionary conference in St. Louis began with a deep dive into the roots of our church body. Dr. Lawrence Rast, historian and president emeritus of Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, gave us a thorough history of Lutheranism in America and the formation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. His teaching helped us reflect on how the Lord has guided His Church through challenges and change, always preserving His Word and Sacraments at the center of our life together. For missionaries serving far from home, it was both humbling and inspiring to see how our work today connects to the faithful witness of generations before us.

Our time together also took us back to Perry County, Missouri, where the first Saxon immigrants settled and planted churches. Walking the same ground where these men and women built homes, schools, and congregations, we were reminded of their sacrifices and their determination to keep the Gospel pure. It was moving to stand where they once stood, realizing that their commitment to Word and Sacrament

ministry continues to shape the work we are called to carry out across Latin America and the Caribbean today

The week concluded with a service of Holy Communion at Trinity Lutheran Church in downtown St. Louis, one of the oldest congregations of our Synod. There. all of us missionaries and our families gathered around the Lord's table and partook of the very chalice once used by C.F.W. Walther, the Synod's first president, and those early Saxon Lutherans. To share in that same cup was a profound reminder that we are joined not only across continents today, but also across the generations, united in Christ who continues to sustain His Church and send His Word into the world





Missionary Care – Enduring Mission

In August, we were blessed by a visit from The role of the Missionary Care Coordinator Tirzah Krey, the Missionary Care Coordinator for the Latin America and Caribbean region. Tirzah brings a unique combination of gifts to this role: she is both rather because of challenges and obstacles a nurse and a deaconess, able to minister to that could have been eased with timely the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of missionaries and their families. Her presence is a reminder that the health and well-being of missionaries are vital to the ongoing work of the Church. By listening, encouraging, and providing practical care, Tirzah helps ensure that we remain strengthened for the task of proclaiming Christ in the places we are called to serve.

is essential because most missionaries do not leave the field due to theological disagreements or lack of desire to serve, but support. Whether it is offering medical advice, guidance through transitions, or spiritual encouragement rooted in God's Word, Tirzah helps us navigate those challenges before they become overwhelming. Her work keeps us focused on the mission-spreading the Gospel, planting Lutheran churches, and showing Christ's mercy-while reminding us that we, too, are cared for by the body of Christ.
