October in Belize

In October, the weather began just as we expected; hot, humid, and heavy, the kind of heat that wraps around you the moment you step outside. But as the month ended, Belize offered us an unexpected gift. A cool front moved in, bringing temperatures down into the mid-80s and easing the humidity, It wasn't "cold" by any northern standard, but after months of relentless heat, it felt refreshing.

This marks the slow transition from the rainy season toward the dry season, an annual rhythm that shapes nearly every part of life here. The frequent downpours have eased, and outdoor work becomes less taxing and far more enjoyable. It's the time of year when the jungle seems to take a long exhale. As the season turns, we're reminded once again of God's faithfulness in all the small things: the weather that changes, the work that continues, and the grace that sustains us through each new day.

All Children Confirmed To Be Well

This month, all of our children had their well-child visits with a local pediatrician here in Belize, a milestone that felt both ordinary and deeply comforting. Each of them checked out healthy and is growing fast, something our pantry confirms daily. The doctor was warm and attentive, and the kids handled the experience with their usual mix of curiosity and humor. It was encouraging to see them cared for by someone who understands the local context and who will walk with us in this part of our life and ministry.

Establishing medical care is one of those quiet but important steps in settling into a new country. Now, if any health concerns arise, we will not need to introduce ourselves or explain years of medical history; we are known, and our children are known. That brings real peace of mind. We're grateful for this relationship, for a pediatrician we can trust, and for the Lord's unfailing provision as He continues to surround us with the care and support, we need in this place where He has called us to serve.

Belize FORO Fall 2025

In late October, we gathered in St. Louis for the Fall FORO, a meeting of congregations. organizations, and individuals who prayerfully and financially support the LCMS mission in Belize. The FORO provides a unique opportunity for partners in the Gospel to sit around the same table, hear updates from the field. and see firsthand how their faithful support is bearing fruit. For those of us serving in Belize. it is a blessing to step back from the daily work and remember that we are not laboring alone: we are upheld by a wide network of brothers and sisters who care deeply about the proclamation of Christ in this beautiful country.

Throughout the two-day gathering, we presented updates on ministry in Valley of Peace, Seine Bight, Orange Walk, and our ongoing partnerships with the Belize Mission Society and the Lutheran Synod of Mexico. These conversations helped paint a fuller picture of what Christ is doing across Belize confirmations, baptisms, catechesis, mercy work, and the



steady growth of relationships in each community. Participants offered valuable insight and encouragement, helping us see challenges clearly and consider new opportunities for mission. Their questions and feedback remind us that the work in Belize is truly shared work, shaped by many voices working toward the same goal: spreading the Gospel. planting Lutheran churches, and showing mercy.

The FORO is also a place for dreaming together about the future. Discussions around Camp Concordia, short-term teams, leadership development, and long-term ministry goals gave us renewed clarity for the road ahead. Even though some

missionaries were unable to attend in person, the unity and support felt throughout the gathering remained strong. As we return to our respective communities and responsibilities, we do so strengthened by the fellowship, wisdom, and partnership that the FORO provides Soli Deo Gloria!



Operation: Play-It-Forward

This month, Gideon, Samuel, Elisha, and I had the opportunity to help move a large playground set from the Cayo District down to Seine Bight. A team from the Belize Mission Society will install it in November, but first it needed to be uncovered from its resting place under tarps in the jungle, hauled up a short hill, and loaded onto a truck for transport. I was

incredibly grateful for the strength and willing spirit of these young men—they turned a hot, heavy job into a joyful afternoon of service. The children of Seine Bight are going to be thrilled with this new addition to their school yard, and it was a blessing to play a small role in getting it there.
